COLD WEATHER IS COMING!

Make sure your children are prepared for the cold weather that will be quickly upon us! Children spend time outside during the school day as long as the "feels like" temperature is zero or above. It is very important that they be prepared for the weather. Please make sure your child comes to school dressed appropriately by wearing a winter jacket, boots, snow pants (once there is snow!), a hat, and gloves or mittens. We recommend your child bring an extra pair of gloves or mittens in case they get wet.



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VISION SCREENING

The annual vision screenings with the Lions Club was completed at Franklin on Wednesday, October 25. All kindergarten, second, and fourth grade students were screened. We cannot thank the Lions Club enough for all their help with this task! Healthy vision is a very important part of being able to learn.

Just a reminder, if your child did not pass the vision screening, a referral letter along with a copy of their results was sent home. Feel free to contact the school nurse if you have any questions.

STUDENT COUNCIL

We are excited to announce that Student Council is up and running! This year, we have 37 third, fourth and fifth grade students excited about being Student Council members. One of our popular community projects we enjoy working on is our food drive. Student Council members enjoy making the food drive posters, announcements and of course, "shopping" the Franklin School hallways for the food items! Watch for the dates which will be announced soon. Last year, with the help of our families and staff members, our Student Council members collected 1,011 pounds of food for Peter's Pantry, which helped many families in our community.

If you have a child in third, fourth, or fifth grade who would be interested in doing good things for our school and local community, they must complete a Student Council application. In 150 words or less, each student must write why they would be a responsible Student Council member and then receive signatures from their parent/guardian, two community members, a friend and two Franklin School teachers. Completed applications can be turned in to the office.

MEDICATION REMINDERS

Does your child require prescription medication to be given at school? If so, these are the guidelines that the office staff must follow:

- A "Consent to Administer Medication to be Given at School" form, must be signed by both parent and doctor noting the name of the medication, dosage amount and time of day it is to be administered. You can pick up a form in the office or find it on the District website under Nursing Services>Parent Forms.
- All medication must be in the original container with the original prescription label on the container, which will be kept locked in the office health room. School personnel will dispense all medication. Students are not allowed to be in possession of medicine at any time.
- Please notify the school office immediately when the medication is discontinued. If the dosage is changed, a new form must be completed.

If your child needs to take nonprescription medication that is not prescribed by a doctor, we request the following:

- The office must have a completed "Consent to Administer Medication to be Given at School" form on file; however, since the medication is not a prescription, doctor's signature is not required.
- The medication must be in the original bottle or bag, or it will not be given.

Only school personnel are allowed to dispense nonprescription medication. If a student comes to school with nonprescription medicine, they must give it to the office so it can be locked in the health room.
