STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

Did you move over the summer? Did you change any of your phone numbers or an e-mail address? How about a new job? If you answered yes to any of these questions, please update your child's gold Census Verification Report which will be coming home soon. It's very helpful when our records are current and accurate to provide for your child(ren)'s safety. When the Census Verification Report is sent home, please review the information, make the necessary changes, sign and return the form to school (regardless if changes are made).

RAPTOR VISITOR MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

To enhance the safety of Franklin School, we utilize our Raptor Visitor Management System to register our visitors. If visitors would like to enter the building during school hours for any reason, they will need to submit a valid state ID or driver's license. The office staff will then scan their information in the National Sex Offender Registry. If approved to enter our school, a nametag will be printed which must be worn on the outermost layer of clothing at all times. All visitors must return to the office to sign out prior to leaving the building.



SCHOOL NURSE MESSAGE

If your child has medication at school, a new Medication Consent form must be completed before medication can be administered. The form can be found on the District website under Nursing Services>Parent Forms, or pick one up from your child's school. Medication provided to the school must be in the original container with the student's full name, name of the medication and dosage.

The start of the school year is also a great time to make sure your child's immunizations are current. Please contact your child's medical provider or health center to schedule an appointment. If you do not want your child to receive these immunizations, a signed waiver of declination must be on file at school. Waivers are available on the District website under Nursing Services>Parent Forms, or in each school office.

SCHOOL DENTAL PROGRAM

The 2023-24 school year is upon us, and it is time to sign your child(ren) up for the school dental program provided by Lakeshore Community Health Care. The Lakeshore Community Health Care provides dental services such as exams, x-rays, cleanings, fluoride, sealants and fillings right here at Franklin School! A bright green dental sign-up form has been sent home



from school with your child(ren). These forms need to be returned to the school office as soon as possible. You will need to fill out one form for EACH child. If you do NOT want this service for your child, please indicate so on the form and return it to school. It is equally important that ALL forms be returned to the school as soon as possible. This helps the dental clinic with both planning and funding the program.
