Also present were James Feil, Interim Superintendent, Jason Bull, Director of Teaching, Learning, and Assessment, Pam Lensmire, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, and Lee Thennes, Lincoln High School Principal.

Math Applications - Textbook Adoption

The process and work currently being navigated towards a textbook adoption that would support the Math Applications course includes:

- 1. The team followed an Implementation Checklist.
- 2. Teachers reviewed and developed a deeper understanding of mathematics standards.
- 3. Teachers identified the power and supporting standards for the course.
- 4. The team identified the criteria to be used in reviewing textbook options. 5. The team identified *Mathematics Core Topics SL 1* by Haese as the preferred textbook. 6. The preferred textbook is an updated version of the current text for this course. 7. The preferred textbook has been available for public review at the District Office since June 22, 2022.

Wisconsin Music Education Association Standards offer a more comprehensive and rigorous approach to Secondary Music Education. A request was made for approval from the Curriculum Committee to move forward in the process to seek support for the identified Academic Standards from the full Board of Education. Matthew Phipps made a motion to support the next step in the process. Tony Vlastelica seconded the motion. All members of the Curriculum Committee supported the execution of the next step in the process.

Policy 5136 - Personal Communication Devices

The members of the Curriculum Committee reviewed and made unanimous revisions based on the feedback from a variety of stakeholders for the second reading and approval by the full Board of Education for Policy 5136 - Personal Communication Devices.

Policy 2240 - Controversial Issues in the Classroom

The members of the Curriculum Committee reviewed and discussed Policy 2240 - Controversial Issues in the Classroom. Final recommendations for this policy were not reached. The following action items were agreed upon:
